This is a nice quick and easy meal which the whole family is sure to enjoy. Great for leftovers for lunch the next day too!

Savoury Mince Rolls

Serving size: Serves 6

Special options: Kid friendly

Course: Lunch, Main

INGREDIENTS

500g mince
1 capsicum, chopped
1 onion, chopped
1 tin tomatoes, crushed
seasoning
3 cup mushrooms, sliced
½ zucchini, chopped
1 cup grated cheese
6-8 crusty bread rolls
1 packet cream of mushroom soup mix (single serving)

METHOD

First, cut holes in the tops of each bread roll with sufficient room to add cooked mince.

Brown mince then add the chopped onion, cook for a few minutes then add chopped capsicum, mushroom and zucchini.

After a few minutes add the tin of crushed tomatoes, cream of mushroom soup mix and a few splashes of seasoning. If the mixture appears to be too dry you can add some tomato paste or maybe one crushed tomato. Simmer on low heat to mix in the flavours for 20 minutes.

Once mince is cooked, spoon into bread rolls, top with grated cheese and put into 200°C oven until cheese is melted and bread rolls are nice and crisp. Serve with a lovely fresh salad.



'Sheriff Smoky'

The Australian Country Music Hall of Fame has launched a special project in recognition of its long-term Patron the late **Smoky Dawson**.

Smoky (pictured) was

Patron of the **Music Hall of Fame** since its inception. It focuses on the heritage of **Australian Country Music**, its history and development.

Smoky died on Wednesday, February 13, aged 94, and as a tribute and to ensure his legend lives on, the **Hall of Fame** will set up a special archive to centre on the important contribution **Smoky** made to **Australian life** – e.g. his '**Wild West Club**' promoted through his radio program in the **1950s** and '**60s**.'

In its prime, **hundreds of thousands** of young **Australians**, with the support and approval of their parents, joined the Club. They received a **badge, identification card and copy of the "Code of the West"** from '**Sheriff Smoky**'.

The Code covered health, citizenship and good behaviour.

It is understood almost **a million** people were members of the Club, an amazing figure, given that **Australia's population** at the time would have been around the 10 million mark.

The Hall of Fame is asking **former Club members**, the '**Deputy Sheriffs**', to **contact the Hall of Fame (PO Box 1842 Tamworth 2340)** noting their Club experiences. Submissions can also be made via the **Hall of Fame website** www.countrymusichalloffame.com.au.

Relatives or friends of former members may be able to tell the Club story of a brother or son or close childhood friend or relation. Contributions will be retained and recorded for a special exhibition on the Club as part of **Smoky's exhibition in the new Country Music Hall of Fame**.

The possibility of preparing special exhibitions and publications based on the material submitted will be explored.

"What Smoky Dawson achieved himself as an entertainer, songwriter, actor, supporter of charities and good causes is on public record and part of Smoky's legacy is how he influenced others, especially children."
