GOING to Nashville was a life-long dream for budding country music star Luke Austen, but never in his wildest of dreams did he imagine he would play Keith Urbana's guitar. Nor did he think he would play a set at the prestigious Aristotelian Global Artist Showcase.

But then again, things have been pretty crazy for the 29-year-old since he took out the 2010 Toyota Star Maker, a prestigious talent search that has unearthed some of Australia's best music stars, including Urban himself.

Since winning the competition in January, Austen has clocked-up 58,000 kilometres while touring Australia, released his debut album Light of Day and travelled to Nashville for the CMA music festival.
